

2012 Moeller Baseball Coaching Staff

Tim Held—Varsity Head Coach-- The 2012 season will be Tim Held's fifth as the varsity head baseball coach following six years as a varsity assistant. Coach Held also spent two years as the assistant junior varsity coach and three years as the freshman assistant coach under Hall of Fame coach Ron Roth. He was the head junior varsity coach for the Bryan (OH) Golden Bears for one year and their head ACME league coach for four summers, capturing one state title. Tim served five years as a basketball coach for the Crusaders, and four years as an assistant for the AABC Walt Sweeney Cardinals.

In Coach Held's first four seasons, the Crusaders have made three trips to the state final four including the 2009 State Championship; they had a record of 101-19 over those four seasons. The 2011 season saw the varsity capture the sectional, district, and state poll titles—the back-to-back state poll titles were a first for the program. The varsity also captured the school's 24th GCL title, 10th City Poll Championship, and 4th State Poll Championship. Coach Held was the 2008, 2009, 2010 and 2011 GCL Coach of the Year, the 2009 City Coach of the Year, the 2009 Bob Sumerel Greater Cincinnati Coach of the Year, and the 2010 State Coach of the Year.

In Coach Held's six seasons as an assistant with the varsity baseball team, he was part of three GCL championships, five sectional championships, four district championships, one regional championship, two city poll championships, one state poll championship, and the 2004 state championship. In addition, three of these teams ended the season nationally ranked.

These successes are due to the tremendous talent and hard work put forth by the members of the baseball program. Over the past ten years, Coach Held has seen Moeller players go to the Atlantic Coast Conference, Atlantic Sun Conference, Atlantic Ten Conference, Big Ten Conference, Big Twelve Conference, Big East Conference, Conference USA, Mid American Conference, and Southern Conference as well as seeing ten players drafted: Cameron Satterwhite in the 50th round in 2005, Andrew Brackman in the 1st round in 2007, Eric Surkamp in the 6th round in 2008, Tyler Stovall in the 20th round in 2008, Ben Hunter in the 29th round in 2008, Greg Williams in the 31st round in 2008 & 12th round in 2011, Alex Wimmers in the 1st round in 2010, Dan Burkhart in the 10th round in 2010, David Whitehead in the 36th round in 2010, and Tom Belza in the 43rd round in 2010.

Coach Held is a teacher in the mathematics department at Moeller. Tim and his wife, Leslie, reside in Montgomery with their sons, Drew and Alex. They are members of All Saints Parish.



Andy Nagel—Varsity Assistant Coach—2012 will be Coach Nagel's 3rd season as a varsity assistant after two years as the junior varsity head coach. In his two years as the JV head coach, he guided the JV Crusaders to a 38-6 record-including 21-0 in 2008-won a GCL League Championship and tied the JV baseball record for best winning percentage.

Nagel is a 1988 Graduate of Moeller. Andy pitched, played first base, second base, third base and designated hitter during his playing days for the Crusaders. In his junior year at Moe he had a team best 1.73 ERA and received the most improved player award that year. Since he played so many positions as a varsity player, he was named First Team All-GCL as a designated hitter his senior year. Coach Nagel was a team co-captain of the 1988 team that went 21-10. Andy played with former Major Leaguers, David Bell and Adam Hyzdu and future Hall of Famer, Ken Griffey Jr.

Nagel earned a baseball scholarship to Walsh University in North Canton, Ohio where he lettered all four years, was a member of Walsh's winningest teams, played outfield and first base and was named First Team All Mid Ohio Conference his senior year. It was at Walsh where Coach Nagel met his wife, Julie, who is a member of the Walsh University Wall of Fame for volleyball.

Coach Nagel is a Senior Loan Officer with ACF Mortgage and real estate agent for Cagney-Weisker. He and his wife Julie have three kids; Jim (17), Tricia (13) and Alex (10) and currently reside in Green Township.



Tony Maccani—Varsity Assistant Coach—Former New York Mets prospect and Cincinnati native, Tony Maccani returns to Moeller High School for his second year as an assistant varsity coach. A 2003 graduate and recipient of the Man of Moeller award, Maccani attended Furman University (Greenville, SC) where he was an All-Conference catcher and member of the 2005 NCAA Regional team.

Maccani's coaching experience began in 2004 as an assistant coach for the Cincinnati Crusaders Baseball Organization. "I am excited to be back at Moeller and have the opportunity to work with these great young men and talented athletes."

Maccani received his bachelor degree in Health and Exercise Science from Furman and currently resides in Loveland.



Marc Marini—Junior Varsity Head Coach--Marc Marini enters his second year as Moeller Junior Varsity Head Coach. Marc comes to Moeller with many years of baseball experience. He started his career at Jacksonville University where he was one of the nation's leading hitters his sophomore year (.439). Marc was named to All-Sunbelt Conference teams in '90 and '91. He was also named to the All Regional team in '91.

Professionally, Marc was signed by the Cleveland Indians and played alongside former Moeller stand-out David Bell. Marc climbed through the ranks of the Indians organization and finished his career at AAA with the Indians and the New York Yankees.

Marc continued his education with an MS at George Washington University and is a certified teacher in Ohio. Marc currently resides in West Chester with his wife Sonia and their children Sofia and Marco.



Mike Cameron—Junior Varsity Assistant Coach--Coach Cameron will be an assistant junior varsity coach after a year as a special advisor to the program in 2011; this after spending two seasons as the freshmen assistant in his second tour of duty with the baseball program. Mike was a baseball coach at Moeller High School for the forty years. For thirty-nine years (1969-2007), he was the head baseball coach. His overall record was 767-303. Four times, 1972, 1989, 1993, and 2004 his teams won the state title. Ten times they were district champions and five times regional champions. Under his guidance,

Moeller won two state poll titles, eight city crowns and 20 Greater Catholic league championships. On six different occasions his teams at Moeller finished the season being nationally ranked.

Over 130 of Coach Cameron's players went on to play college baseball, while 28 have signed professional contracts. Eight of these former players have made it to the major leagues. The list includes: Buddy Bell '69, Len Matuszek '72, Bill Long '78, Barry Larkin '82, Ken Griffey Jr. '87, David Bell '90, Mike Bell '93, and Adam Hyzdu '90.

Coach Cameron was inducted into the Moeller High School Hall of Fame in 1991, the Ohio High School Baseball Coaches Hall of Fame in 1993, the Purcell Marian High School Hall of Fame in 2001, and the LaRosa's Hall of Fame in 2002. In 1998, Coach Cameron was selected the region 4 National Coach of the year. Five times he has been named coach of the year in greater Cincinnati and 17 times the league's coach of the year. In 2007, Mike was named the Bob Sumner Tire and Service High School Coach of the Year presented by the Cincinnati Reds.

Mike was a teacher in the Health and Physical Education department at Moeller, where he was also the department chair, before retiring at the end of the 2009 school year.

Mike lives in Deerfield Township with his wife Nancy. They have three children; Karen, Lynn, Joe and seven grandchildren.



Mike Hayes—Junior Varsity Assistant Coach--Coach Mike Hayes begins his first season on the Moeller baseball staff as an assistant junior varsity coach. Coach Hayes attended Olmsted Falls High School in suburban Cleveland where he played baseball and football. After attending the University of Hawaii for a year and working as the Assistant to the Director of Baseball Operations, Mike returned to the mainland and earned his English literature degree at the Ohio State University. Mike received his master's degree from Xavier University and is currently working on his doctorate at the University of Dayton.

Coach Hayes currently teaches English at Moeller. He resides in Monroe with his wife Amy.



Pat McLaughlin—Freshman Head Coach—Coach Pat McLaughlin returns for a second stint with the Moeller Baseball program. Pat was an assistant freshman coach his first two years at Moeller and he will lead the frosh this time around.

Coach McLaughlin is a 1996 Moeller graduate where he was a football and baseball captain for the Crusaders. He went on to the University of Dayton where he played football. Upon graduation, he became a graduate assistant at the University of Memphis and obtained a master's in education, specializing in instruction and curriculum leadership.

Pat currently teaches Social Studies at Moeller and is also the varsity football offensive coordinator. Pat and his wife, Layne, have three sons: Patrick Thomas, Jack Curtis and Brooks. They live in Morrow and attend St. Susanna Parish.



Ron Roth—Freshman Assistant Coach—Coach Roth begins his 22nd season at Moeller, all with the freshmen. For the first 21 years, Ron was the head freshman coach compiling a record of 404-80. He has also been with the Moeller Junior Varsity Golf Team for 19 years piling up a 204-29 record. In addition to leading freshman at Moeller, Ron has been coaching amateur baseball in the Cincinnati area for the past 49 years. He has coached everything from t-ball to 11 years at the University of Cincinnati. Over this period of time he has compiled an overall baseball coaching record of 1610- 478. This includes his summer AABC teams that won the Mickey Mantle World Series in 1970 and 1971, runners-up in the Sandy Koufax World Series in 1987 and won the Pony League World Series in 1991 with a 66-1 record. Ron was honored in 2006 by the Hamilton County Sports Hall of Fame for his involvement in over 4500 sporting events in the Greater Cincinnati area and in 2012 when he was inducted into the Moeller Hall of Fame.

Ron works as a real estate broker and appraiser for Irwin I. Roth, Inc and has also been hired by Major League Baseball for the past 32 years as an Official Scorer for the Cincinnati Reds. Coach Roth lives with his wife, Anne, of 41 years. The couple has two children, Julie and Alan, and are blessed with three wonderful grandchildren, Jake, Hailey, and Alyssa.



Ken Robinson—Freshman Assistant Coach—Ken Robinson enters his third year at Moeller and the second as the Freshman Assistant Coach. He is a native of Cincinnati and he comes to Moeller from LaSalle where he was an assistant varsity coach in his first year, and the last four years as an assistant freshman coach. In addition to being scouted by the Montreal Expo's as a middle infielder in 1981 he also brings over 30 years of baseball experience in the greater Cincinnati area.

He is a student at Mt. St. Joseph and a local business owner. Married for 20 years, Ken and his wife Catherine have three beautiful children: (Lamar 22, LaSalle "08", Thomas More 2012) Alicia 10, and Anjel 8. And they reside in Pleasant Ridge.
