



2012 Moeller Freshmen Baseball – Game Summaries

MOELLER 14 CENTERVILLE 4

The Moeller Freshman Baseball Team opened the 2012 season with a 14-4 win in a scrimmage game at Centerville. The Moeller bats stroked 13 hits in their first game on a baseball field this season. Led by Bailey Montoya's 3 for 3 including a double and 3 rbi's. The Crusaders scored 4 runs in the top of the second inning. Mitchell Meece led off the inning with a walk. With one out, Doug Bates singled to right sending Meece to third. Grant Macciocchi drove the ball deep to center allowing Meece to tag up at third for a sac fly and Moeller's first run of the year. More was to come. Kyle Dockus singled to bring up the top of the order for the second time. Jordan Ramey delivered with a two run double to put the Frosh up 3-0. After a Josh Hollander walk, Bailey Montoya singled to send our fourth run of the inning home. The Moeller bats were not done. After the Elks answered with 3 runs of their own in the bottom of the second, Big Moe scored what proved to be all they needed in the top of the third inning,..... 6 more runs to send the score to 10-4. Mitchell Bault was the starting pitcher going an impressive 3 innings in his first start. Mitch allowed 3 runs, 2 of which were earned, on 4 hits, no walks and 4 strikeouts. Richie Wallace and Grant Macciocchi each pitched an inning scattering 5 hits between them. Matt Rusche faced one batter before the game was called due to lightning in the bottom of the sixth. The highlight of the day was the two run home run drilled by Adam Wilson over the left field fence in the 5th inning. Others collecting hits were: Josh Hollander, Cole Dubell, Mitchell Meece, Joey Madsen, Grant Macciocchi, and 2 hits by Doug Bates.

The Moeller Freshman will scrimmage Springboro next week.

MOELLER 9 SPRINGBORO 1

The Springboro Panthers traveled to Schuler Park to take on the Moeller Freshman in their second scrimmage of the year today. Moeller scored early. Jordan Ramey led the game off with a walk and went to third on starting pitcher, Josh Hollander's base hit. Bailey Montoya walked to load the bases and Mitch Bault followed with a long sac fly to center to score Ramey. The Crusaders posted three more runs in the home half of the third inning. Kyle Dockus singled to start the inning. Jordan Ramey continued his torrid hitting by collecting his first of two hits on the day, a double to right. Josh Hollander had a sac fly to left to score Dockus followed by a base hit up the middle by Montoya to score Ramey. Moeller's third run of the inning came off a ground ball hit by Marshall Eippert to score Bailey from second. The last five runs of the game came in the next inning. Hank McKay singled and Grant Macciocchi walked. Kyle Dockus dropped a sac bunt to move the runners up. Ramey collected his second hit on the day to score two, which was followed by Montoya's second hit of the day and fifth of the short year. Doug Bates knocked in Moeller's ninth run on a sac fly to center. Sam Wallbillig also added a line drive base hit in the bottom of the sixth inning.

Moeller used six pitchers on the day each tossing an inning. The combination of Josh Hollander, Jared Diesslin, Matt Rusche, Mitch Bault, Hank McKay, and Tanner Marklay held the Panthers to one run on two hits, walking two and striking out seven Springboro batters. The Moeller Freshman pre-season record goes to 2-0.

Moeller 12 ROSS 2

The Moeller Freshman Baseball Team opened the 2012 season on a solid note by downing the Ross Rams by a score of 12-2 in 6 innings. After the game the Frosh presented Coach McLaughlin with the game ball commemorating his 1st career win as the Head Freshman Baseball Coach. The Rams held the Crusaders at bay in the first inning before allowing a run in the bottom of the second inning. With one out, Mitchell Meece slugged his first of four hits on the day, a double over the left fielders head. With 2 outs, Kyle Dockus singled to drive in Meece. Moeller tacked on 3 more runs in the third inning when JJ Johnson led off with a single. Ronnie Murphy reached on an error and Mitch Meece smacked his second double of the day sending Johnson and Murphy rolling home. Grant Macciocchi singled to score Meece. The Frosh were not done. The fourth inning was the icing on the cake. Bailey Montoya singled, after walks to Johnson, Mitch Bault, and Murphy, Meece singled, Macciocchi walked, Kyle Dockus roped his second single of the day. The Frosh scored their last two runs of the inning on a double drilled to right center by Jordan Ramey, his second of the day, and a sac fly from Josh Hollander. This sent Moeller to a 11-0 lead which proved all we needed for starting pitcher Hank McKay. Hank shut out the Rams in 4 innings on only 1 hit with 1 walk and 6 strikeouts. Richie Wallace pitched the 5th inning and Cole Dubell came in to slam the door in the top of the 6th inning. Moeller scored their 12th run in the bottom of the 6th inning on a lead off double by Josh Hollander and a single from Marshall Eippert. The Moeller season record stands at 1-0.

MOELLER 10 GLEN ESTE 0

The Moeller Freshman logged their second run rule game in as many days. This time behind the shutout pitching of Matt Rusche and Tanner Marklay. Rusche started the game going four innings allowing only 2 scattered hits with 2 walks and 5 strikeouts. Marklay tossed the last scoreless inning. The Crusaders scored two runs in the first inning due to 3 Glen Este errors and a Bailey Montoya triple. Big Moe added 5 more runs in the second inning to run the score to 7-0. Mitchell Meece started the rally with a single. Grant Macciocchi dropped a bunt for a base hit moving Meece to second. Kyle Dockus singled to load the bases. Jordan Ramey reached on an error to score Meece. Josh Hollander doubled to pick up two rbis and Montoya and JJ Johnson each hit sac flies to score the last two runs. In the home half of the fifth inning, pinch hitter Eric Conner hit a shot over the left fielder's head to lead off the inning with a double. Nick Meece collected his second hit in as many at bats. Moeller's Freshman Baseball team opened the GCL league play by caging the Elder Panthers, with another GCL classic. The game started out as a pitching duel between Moeller's Mitch Bault and Elder's Cappel. Each pitcher retired nine or the first ten batters they faced over the first three innings of the game. It was the Crusaders who broke the ice. Josh Hollander led off the fourth inning with a base hit and stole second base. Catcher Bailey Montoya hit a shot to right center for a double scoring Hollander. Montoya stole third and came home on a wild pitch for Moeller's second run. Elder came roaring back by posting two runs of their own on three hits in the bottom of the inning. After a scoreless fifth inning, the Frosh came out swinging. Once again, it was Josh Hollander who led off the inning with a single. Montoya walked and Adam Wilson came in to pinch run. JJ Johnson unloaded a rocket to left center field scoring Hollander. Ronnie Murphy then administered the knockout punch by hitting a laser to right for a triple sending home Wilson and Johnson for what proved to be the winning runs. Mitchell Meece added an insurance run with a base hit to score Murphy. Jordan Ramey added a seventh inning base hit. The hitting leader on the day was Josh Hollander who was 3 for 4. Mitchell Bault pitched five innings allowing two runs, both earned on three hits with two strikeouts. For the first time this year, the Moeller Frosh had to come from behind to ground the St. Xavier Bombers in a titanic offensive struggle. Down 2-0 after two innings and Bomber starting pitcher Jonathan Deifer mowing down Crusader batters, the bottom fell out for him. Moeller sent eleven batters to the plate and scored seven runs. Deifer gave up two hits, walked four and hit two batters in the inning before leaving the game. When the inning ended, Big Moe was up 7-2. The Bombers would not go away. After scoring two more runs in the top of the fourth inning when Josh Hollander reached on an error, Bailey Montoya lined a single to left. Both moved up on a wild pitch. JJ Johnson brought Holly home on a sac fly and Montoya scored on Mitch Bault's single. X put four runs on the board in the bottom for the fourth to bring the score to 9-7.

It was Hank McKay that slammed the door on the Bombers. In relief of Josh Hollander and Cole Dubell, McKay came in, got out of the four run inning and pitched the last three innings allowing only two hits, two walks, and four strikeouts to pick up his second win of the year. The big story, however, was the day Mitch Bault had at the plate. Mitch went 4 for 4 with five RBI's. Other hitters collecting two hits were Josh Hollander, and Bailey Montoya. "The Man on the Bench" is the backbone to Moeller Baseball. There was no greater example of that today in a doubleheader with the Noblesville Millers. From pitching to defense to hitting, all 26 players contributed to wins five and six on the year for the Moeller Freshman. It was "game on" when Jordan Ramey lined the second pitch of the day off the centerfield wall for a triple. Josh Hollander walked and stole second base. JJ Johnson ripped a single to score Ramey and Hollander. After Mitch Bault was hit by the pitch and Hank McKay walked, Mitch Meece singled home two more runs. Richie Wallace reached on a Miller error and Kyle Dockus reached on a fielder's choice. Ramey walked in his second at bat of the inning and Josh Hollander cleared the bases with a double to put the Crusaders up 7-0 in the first inning. The defense set the tone in the bottom of the first. After Noblesville's lead off hitter led the game off with a single, Tait Cunningham, Josh Hollander and Mitch Bault turned a 4-6-3 double play. Moeller went on to score four more runs in the game, highlighted by a monster home run over the left field wall and onto the roof of the press box or the adjoining field by Jordan Ramey and a laser home run just inside the left field foul pole by Josh Hollander. Hank McKay just missed a third home run hitting one off the very top of the fence that kicked back on the field. Other hitting leaders in the game were Mitch Meece with two hits including a double, while Richie Wallace and Mitch Bault (double) each collected hits.

Pitching was also the story line here. JJ Johnson in his first start of the year went four innings to pick up the win. JJ scattered two hits and struck out four batters. Tanner Marklay came in to pitch the last three innings to pick up the save. Tanner allowed one run, it was earned on four hits with one walk and one strikeout. The Moeller Freshman now stands at 5-0 and 2-0 in the GCL.

MOELLER 14 NOBLESVILLE 2

The second game was not much different than the first game-great hitting, pitching and defense. The Crusaders banged out 13 hits including a 3 for 4 performance by Grant Macciocchi that included two doubles, a sac fly and six RBI's. Moeller's blowout inning came in the third inning. Marshall Eippert got thing started by driving a single to center. Doug Bates singled and Adam Wilson walked. Grant Macciocchi notched his second double on the day to send home Wilson and Sam Waldbillig who was pinch running for Bates. Bailey Montoya then sent a shot to left center for a double of his own scoring two more runs. The offense never stopped, in the top of the fifth inning, Jared Diesslin led off with a base hit. The other component in this game was the pitching. Doug Bates pitched four innings allowing one earned run on two hits, while walking three and striking out three batters. Matt Rusche pitched the last inning to close the game. The Moeller Freshman is 6-0 and 2-0 to lead the GCL.

MOELLER 10 LASALLE 0 5 innings

The story line for today's GCL game is easy. Mitchell Bault tossed a perfect "no hit" game to lead the freshman to their first round sweep of the GCL south in downing the LaSalle Lancers, 10-0. Bault faced the minimum 15 batters in the five inning game, striking out three batters. The Moeller bats were hot early. Jordan Ramey cracked a leadoff double over the center fielders head. With one out, Bailey Montoya walked. With Ramey and Montoya advancing on a wild pitch, JJ Johnson brought Ramey home on a sac fly/E8. Back-to-back hits from Mitch Bault and Ronnie Murphy put the Crusaders up 3-0. Mitch Meece collected a sac fly followed by a base hit from Grant Macciocchi. When the inning ended the Big Moe was up 6-0. The third inning netted Moeller two more runs. Mitch Meece's base hit and Kyle Dockus set up two RBI's for Josh Hollander's double--Moeller 8-0. The Moeller bats sealed the deal for Bault's perfect game in the bottom of the fifth inning. Mitch Meece led of the inning with his second hit of the day. After walks to Macciocchi and Ramey to load the bases, Josh Hollander singled to collect his third and fourth RBI's on the day for Moeller's ninth and tenth runs. The Moeller Freshman record is now 7-0 and 3-0 in the GCL. The Freshman play Dayton Carroll at Blue Ash on Wednesday.

MOELLER 12 DAYTON CARROLL 2

After walks to Josh Hollander and Bailey Montoya, JJ Johnson stepped up and drilled a double to right center to drive in two runs.
